

Jails in Indian Country: Available Resources

Jails in Indian Country, 2007, is a recurring report based on the Annual Survey of Jails in Indian Country. With the exception of 2005 and 2006, the survey has been conducted continuously since 1998 providing the only correctional data on confinement facilities, detention centers, jails, and other facilities operated by tribal authorities or the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA). The report includes data on the number of adults and juveniles confined, type of offense, number of persons confined on the last weekday of each month, average daily population, peak population and admissions and releases in June 2007, number of inmate deaths, rated capacity, and facility crowding. It also presents findings on staffing, health care services, treatment and counseling programs, and education and employment programs.
